SUMMARY OF ARBITRAL PANEL RULING

1. China's claims to sovereign rights jurisdiction, and to historic rights encompassed by the so-called nine-dash-line are contrary to the UNCLOS and are without lawful effect.

2. Mischief Reef and Second Thomas Shoal are part of the Phl EEZ and continental shelf.

None of the features is an island that can generate its own EEZ.
China has unlawfully interfered with the enjoyment and exercise of the sovereign rights of the Philippines with respect to the living and non-living resources of its EEZ and continental shelf

5. China has unlawfully violated its obligations under the **Convention to protect and preserve the marine** environment at Scarborough Shoal, Second Thomas Shoal, Cuarteron Reef, Fiery Cross Reef, Gaven Reef, Johnson Reef, Hughes Reef and Subi Reef. 6. China's construction on Mischief Reef and deployment of law enforcement vessels are violations of the **Convention and pose serious risks to the Philippines.** 7. China's subsequent activities, including dredging, artificial island building and other construction activities are unlawful.
